| Virginia "Ginny" Macro Citizen's Award | During her time in town, Virginia "Ginny" Macro, has made a significant contribution to the lives of townspeople, families and students. Her volunteer service for the Historical Society, Friends of Wood Memorial Library and Historic District Commission have left an indelible mark on our community. While serving on the Historical Society for 37 years, including as its Chair for three years, Ginny was instrumental in creating a guided history of South Windsor to celebrate the Historical Society's 40 th anniversary, enhancing the community's appreciation of the rich history of our town and the people who helped shape it. Ginny also worked with the Friends of Wood Memorial Library, which, secured a grant to create the Nowashee Village, visited by the district's third grade students every year. During her service on the town Historic District Commission, Ginny's efforts have contributed significantly in ensuring that the town's historic landmarks were properly documented and made available to the community. Ginny's passion for history, literature and learning has surely inspired countless others to explore the world of books and cultivate a love for reading, learning, and volunteering. |
| William "Bill" Marshall Citizen's Award | Since moving to South Windsor in 1985, Bill has been a driving force in multiple community initiatives, and has made significant contributions to several important projects that have positively impacted our town. Bill has been an active member of the South Windsor Food Alliance whose mission is to increase awareness of the health and environmental benefits of eating locally grown foods. The Alliance established school yard vegetable gardens and organized the South Windsor Farmers Market. Bill has also been involved in several projects that aim to enrich the lives of South Windsor residents. He volunteered at the Varney Farm Foodshare program, which provides nutritious food to families in need. He worked in conjunction with the South Windsor Boundless Playground Committee in the creation of a Sensory Garden to provide for a learning experience for children of all abilities. He was also a key figure in the development of the Child Development Center Children's Garden and Nature's Classroom Project, which teaches children about the importance of environmental conservation and sustainable living. In addition, Bill founded the South Windsor Invasive Plant Working Group. Spearheading the effort, in partnership with several town departments and volunteers to remove, control and provide community education regarding invasive plant species. This project is enthusiastically supported by the community, with over 1000 hours of work by over 230 community volunteers since 2018, through 39 work parties to address invasive plant species throughout the town. The project has served to inform the public by hosting educational booths at town events, as well as supported numerous Scouts to earn Merit Badges, and has seen participation by the SWHS Environmental Club. As an initial founding member of the South Windsor Soccer Club, Bill coached boys recreational and travel soccer teams. He served as Referee Director, developing the listing of state certified referees and assigning them to in-town games. His dedication to coaching and |
